






#### **Ethnicity of Participating Families**



### Locations of Families Served in 2016-17




## Services Units Provided to Individuals






#### Parents As Teachers Satisfaction Survey



#### Goal of Survey: Measure parents opinion of PAT program impacts



## Early Intervention Partnership Focus Group

<u>A focus group with the Early Intervention Partnership participants was</u> <u>facilitated on July 14, 2016 by the First 5 Program Evaluation Team.</u>

"...So it is really just nice to come and refresh and remember all the resources you do have because I think we all are really busy, busy people and we are all helping a ton of people and come and remember all the things that we have and see all the new things we have."

*"It's making a large impact. So many of our programs are not just to work with a child, but holistically, so it's nice here where It started out at my agency, we had several people coming and then it's narrowing it down a little bit to who really needs to be at this meeting, and I think that is what partnership has come to, a nice core."* 

SP Objective 4: Families from all cultural backgrounds are easily able to access services and resources through an integrated system

### Summary of 2016-17 Findings

**<u>OBJECTIVE 1</u>**: Parents will receive support to increase their knowledge in child rearing, family relationships and community resources

- 599 parents were served
- Satisfaction surveys showed increases in all items measuring parenting and parent-child interaction
- There were significant increases in family literacy practices from baseline to six-month follow-up

**OBJECTIVE 2:** Increase access to quality early care and education programs that integrate cognitive, social and emotional development for all three and four year old children

- 799 children were served through home visits, playgroups and/or Kinder Camp
- 68 children were referred to an early care and education program (preschool)
- 64 out of 69 students completed Kinder Camp with an attendance rate of 80% or better

**<u>OBJECTIVE 3</u>**: Increase health access to prevention and primary health care services for pregnant women and children birth through age 5

- Over 94% of families had health insurance, a medical home, and preventative care
- Children receiving oral health care increased by 27%

**<u>OBJECTIVE 4</u>**: Families from all cultural backgrounds are easily able to access services and resources through an integrated system

- 46% of families were Hispanic, and bilingual services were provided
- Participants in the Early Intervention Partnership find it beneficial to their work with children and families
