THE STATE PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

The State Preschool Program has 8 sites which offer creative, hands-on learning for kids including math, literacy, science, art and discovery centers. Free to income-qualified families, with part-day and full-day schedules available. Private pay spots available with part-day and full-day schedules available. We have experienced staff in a safe and nurturing environment with nutritional meals served.



SCHOOL READINESS

School Readiness program provides parent education and support to families with children ages 0-5 at no cost and with no income eligibility requirements. The services offered include one-on-one parent education using Parents as Teachers home visitation curriculum, weekly playgroups, referrals to various community resources, access to dental and health care services and developmental screenings. School Readiness home visitors want to partner with you to help your child reach their fullest potential!



HEALTHY FAMILIES TEHAMA

Healthy Families Tehama offers you a Personal Support Coach to help you be the best parent(s) you can be. Services include family-centered emotional support, referrals to other services, assistance with navigatin access to services in the community and education and career goal setting. Services are offered in your home or place of your choice. Your Coach helps you gain the tools you need to have a healthy baby, be the best parent you can be and give your child a solid start in life. There are no costs or income eligibility requirements for these services. Healthy Families Tehama serves pregnancy to age 3.



HEALTHY BEGINNINGS

Healthy Beginnings is a Public Health Nursing program that provides education, referrals and case management. This program is available to pregnant women and families with young children.

Public Health Nurses Provide: Growth and Developmental Assessments and Education; Coordination of services; Parent Education; Coordination/Referral to community resources; Safety instruction; Information on health topics and nutrition; other services may be available based on individual needs.



NOTHERN CALIFORNIA CHILD DEVELOPMENT, INC. (NCCDI)

NCCDI offers programs such as Early Head Start and Head Start that promote school readiness of children ages birth to 5 from low-income families by supporting their development in a comprehensive way. They deliver services to children and families in core areas of early learning, health, and family wellbeing while engaging parents as partners every step of the way. NCCDI offer Head Start preschool programs, which primarily serve 3 and 4 year old children, and Early Head Start programs designed for infants, toddlers and pregnant women.
